Authorities arrested him after an undercover operation confirmed that "Dr. Love" had been practicing medicine without a license … once again. "The Imposter Doctor Con," the season finale of "The Con," airs **FRIDAY, SEPT. 9** (8:00-9:00 p.m. EDT), on ABC and next day on demand and on <u>Hulu</u>.
