Freeform has picked up "Love Trip: Paris," an unscripted dating series filmed entirely in Paris, to series. In "Love Trip: Paris," four American girls, unlucky in love in their own country, move into a penthouse in the middle of Paris to find a floor of French suitors waiting to date them. Is this love trip to Paris their one-way ticket to romance, or are they headed for heartbreak in another language? The series comes from FOX Alternative Entertainment and AH Production/Satisfaction Group,

who originated the format, and is executive produced by Susan House and narrated by Matt Rogers ("I Love That for You").

"Love Trip: Paris" premieres on **TUESDAY, FEB. 14**, at 9:00 p.m. EST/PST with a two-episode premiere and will air weekly at 10:00 p.m. subsequently, next day on <u>Hulu</u>.

The four ladies searching for love include the following:
