The final episode of "Let The World See" follows what Ms. Mamie Till-Mobley and her family did in the face of the acquittal of the men who murdered Emmett Till and how Ms. Mamie Till-Mobley's actions helped to shape the civil rights movement. The program examines why, after two FBI re-investigations, Ms. Mamie Till-Mobley and her family's quest for justice continues and how the questions she raised and the actions she took remain central to the present-day fight for justice. The episode features interviews with Ms. Mamie Till-Mobley and Emmett Till's cousins **Rev. Wheeler Parker**, who was a witness to his abduction, as well as **Ms. Thelma Wright** and **Ms. Ollie Gordon**; recording artist and activist **Common**; former first lady **Michelle Obama**; **Rev. Jesse Jackson Sr.**; retired FBI agent **Lent Rice**; professors **Dr. Khalil Gibran Muhammad** and **Gloria J. Browne-Marshall** and more.
